Starting with this issue *Cognitive Science* becomes the official journal of the Cognitive Science Society. The membership of the Society will receive the journal as part of their dues. Henceforth the journal's editors and policies will be determined by the Governing Board of the Society.

Cognitive Science is multidisciplinary, requiring tools and insights from many different scientific areas. We intend to broaden the range of articles published in the journal to include more linguistics, philosophy, developmental psychology, cognitive anthropology, the neurosciences, etc. The goal is that the Society and journal should reflect the broad range of interests and knowledge required for the emergence of a substantive science of cognition.

In conjunction with the attempt to broaden the journal, the invited papers from the 1979 La Jolla Conference on Cognitive Science will be published in Volume 4, starting with this issue. The editor for these papers will be Donald A. Norman. In addition to their publication here the papers will also appear in a book published by Ablex and Lawrence Erlbaum Associates.

The Society sponsors an annual meeting to bring together speakers from the various cognitive sciences. The second meeting will be held at Yale University, June 16–19, 1980. Information about the conference is included in the announcement printed at the back of this issue.
